HB 259 W/ HA 1	Williams, Pinkney	Requires lead screening for children ages 12 months and older before enrollment or continued attendance in child care facilities and schools.	Senate Ready List 5/5/26	Not Required
SS 1 FOR SB 278	Paradee, Harris	Requires DHSS Purchase of Care (POC) program to authorize summer child care providers starting January 1 so families can enroll kids in camps before they fill. HCR 122	Moore, Brown	Establishes the Early Childhood Education Solutions Task Force to study and make findings and recommendations regarding a model of mixed-delivery, non-compulsory public pre-K that covers all 3- and 4-year-olds in this State by 2035.	House Education, 5/5/26	Not Required
HJR 10	Ross Levin, Cruce	Indicates that POC reimbursement rates for providers serving children ages 0–5 should be increased by 10% for FY2027 across all	House Appropriations 4/23/26	\$9M FY27

<u>HB 312</u>	K. Williams, Pinkney	Amends the Childhood Lead Poisoning Prevention Act to update the definition of confirmatory blood lead testing.	Signed 5/21/26	Not Required
<u>HB 387</u>	Hilovsky, Ross Levin, Buckson	Gradually raises the income eligibility threshold for Delaware's Purchase of Care (POC) childcare subsidy program from 200% to 275% of the Federal Poverty Level over five years, with a sunset clause expiring June 30, 2032. <u>SB 293</u>	Paradee, Harris	Deems ACA-accredited youth camps as meeting equivalent OCCL health and safety requirements, enabling them to qualify as Purchase of Care providers and expanding subsidized summer care options.	House Education 6/4/26	Not required
<u>SB 294</u>	Cruce, K. Johnson	Makes full-time students pursuing associate or bachelor's degrees eligible for Purchase of Care child care assistance, and excludes student financial aid from income calculations for eligibility purposes.	Senate Finance 5/13/26	\$1.47M FY27
<u>HS 1 for HB 47 w/ HA 1</u>	K. Williams, Poore	Removes the option for private schools and youth camps to use name-based background checks or opt out of background checks entirely.	Signed 9/2/25	Indeterminable
<u>HB 419 w/ HA 1</u>	Griffith, Heffernan, K. Williams, Lockman	Provides that a child is automatically eligible for Purchase of Care upon placement in foster care.	House Ready List 5/20/26	Not Required
<u>HB 410</u>	Griffith, Minor- Brown, Bush, Heffernan, Poore	Establishes an Early Childhood Education Endowment. The State Treasurer is directed to transfer 1% of the annual revenue from the Corporate Franchise Tax to initially fund the Endowment.	House Administration 6/4/26	Unlisted
<u>HB 477</u>	Minor-Brown, K. Smith, Pettyjohn, Lockman	Directs the Interagency Resource Management Committee to coordinate planning, program development, and funding related to child care affordability initiatives.	House Administration 6/4/26	Unlisted
